
MODULE 4: The Continents

Key concepts in Unit 4:

- Phoneme segmentation (separating sounds in words-"put it on your fingers")
- Concept of a consonant digraph: Focus will be on: wh, ch, sh, th, ck
- A digraph is two letters (usually consonants) that make one sound; often the sound is unique
- Decoding three-<u>sound</u> words with digraphs
- Spelling three-sound words with digraphs
- Spelling of ck at the end of words (onesyllable words, with one short vowel)
- Sample words: thin, path, rock, dish, when, chin, shop
