# HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES - 1992

DORIS THORNTON BUNDY, CLASS OF 1953. A versatile athlete, Doris was known for her speed and enthusuiasm as a varsity letter winner in field hockey, as a halfback; a guard in basketball; and a third baseman in softball. Additionally, she was member of the Future Homemankers of America, Teen Club, Hall Patrol, and Art and Yearbook staffs. She currently resides in Riverside, California, and is a corrections officer in the San Bernadino, Sheriff's Department.

THOMAS KANE CLASS OF 1955. Tom was a very versatile athlete, lettering in four sports. In football he was a varsity performer for three as a quarterback and linebacker. Tom was the team leader and Captain his senior year. During Tom's three years, Glassboro football earned an 18 - 5 record including the South Jersey Group III Championship. During the Winter Tom was the center of the basketball team and even wrestled in varsity matches his junior year. In baseball Tom matched his football success. Tom was the pitcher and shortstop on the South Jersey Championship team. In school Tom was a top student, President of the student Council and the Class vice-president. Tom went on the Drexel University and presented owns his own steel designing company in Bellmawr.

TOM FANFARILLO, CLASS OF 1941. Tom was perhaps the most versatile athlete ever to play at Glassboro High School. He was a star in every sport in which he participated. In football he played three years winning All Star recognition in Gloucester County and in South Jersey. Tom's hard hitting defensive style was only overshadowed by his offensive talents as a halfback, placing hom among the top scorers in South Jersey. He also excelled in basketball. He was the leading scorer on a very successful team, possessing outstanding speed, defensive skills, as well as winning the prestigious foul shooting contest. Tom was also a four letter winner in baseball. He was voted team captain his senior year. He led Gloucester County in home runs, maintaining a .430 batting average, as well as leading the team in stolen bases. After school, Tom's talents did not go unrecognized, he received tryouts with the Philadelphia Athletics. He continued on, playing semi-pro ball for a number of years and was well known in athletic circles throughout South Jersey.

VINCE MENNA, CLASS OF 1957. Vince was an excellent two sport performer for Glassboro High School. He excelled in football and track. In football, Vince earned three varsity letters as a middle linebacker and an offensive guard. In his senior year he was honored as the Lineman of The Week by the Brooks-Irvine Club. and was named to the All South Jersey team. In track, Vince was the senior captain and an excellent shot put and discus thrower. Vince attended Princeton University and played football for two years. He is presently a pediatrician in Doylestown, Pa. and serves as the team Doctor for Central Bucks East high School where he can be seen on the sidelines during all their football games.

RALPH BUD LOPER, CLASS OF 1960. Ralph was a top three sport performer for Glassboro high School earning a total of eight varsity letters, three in football, two in basketball and three in baseball. In football, Ralph was the end on the top team in Gloucester County. ralph's play at end helped Glassboro earn three consecutive victories over Paulsboro in the traditional Thanksgiving Day game. In basketball, Ralph earned All Conference honors on the first ever Olympic Conference Team. He was a strong rebounder and a smooth left hand shooter. In baseball, Ralph was a power hitting golden glove first baseman. Ralph graduated from Glassboro State College and is presently a teacher/coach in Boise, Idaho.

WILLIAM " SKIPPER" CLARK, CLASS OF 1960 Another in a long line of outstanding athletes, Skipper lettered in four sports. In football, he was a halfback and safety; in basketball, a quick, smoothe, ballhandling guard, with a soft jump shot; in track, a broad jumper and in baseball, a left handed pitcher, first baseman and outfielder. He received the Most Athletic Award in his senior year. He continued his education at Delaware State, Dover, receiving a BS degree in physical education in 1964. While at Delaware State, he has a brilliant career in baseball, as a pitcher and outfielder, and was named to the Central Inter-Collegiate Athletic Association (CIAA) baseball team all four years. Upon graduation in 1964, his #44 was retired. He had baseball tryouts with the Kansas City Athletics, Pittsburgh Pirates and the Phillies. he is employed by the State of New Jersey as a physical therapist at the Woodbine Training Center Woodbine. He and his family reside in Cape May Courthouse, N.J.

JOE BROOKS, CLASS OF 1959. Joe is remembered for his intensity in basketball and track. he was elected Captain of both squads in his senior year. In basketball, Joe was a guard, known for his passing and defensive skills. In 1959, Glassboro, a group III school, set a scoring record by defeating Paulsboro 107 - 42. In the South Jersey playoffs, they defeated Woodbury, but lost in the next round to defending Champions Morrestown. Morrestown was led by the South Jersey leading scored, Ed Douglas and future Penn State All American and NFL linebacker Dave Robinson. Joe was one of the leading scorers on the team averaging 15 points a game for a Glassboro team that finished with an 18 - 6 record. For his all around ability, Joe was voted the team's most valuable player by his team mates. In track Joe competed in the half mile and the mile relay team.. His efforts helped Glassboro win the first ever Olympic Conference track title. Additionally he was a member of the National Honor society, a Boy's State representative, a member of the Student Government, the Jester's Club, the Latin Club and the Future Teachers of America. Following high school, Joe attended Springfield College of Massachusetts, and received a BS degree in Business Administration from Villanova university. He received an MBA from Arizona State and is currently pursuing a Ph. D. in M. I. S. at Indiana University

WOODROW "WOODY" WILLIAMS, CLASS OF 1960. Woody was a versatile athlete, paricipating in three sports. In football, he was a guard, linebacker and defensive end; in basketball, a guard; and in track, a hurdler and a member of the mile relay team. In his senior year, he was an outstanding performer in track, setting records in the 120 yard high hurdles and the 180 yard hurdles. Additionally, he was a member of the HUB staff, Gymnastics Club and the Hall Patrol. He continued his education at Morgan State University, Baltimore, Maryland, receiving a BS degree in Physical Education in 1964. While at Morgan State University, he excelled in swimming, and waas named to the Central Inter-Scholastic Athletic Association (CIAA) swimming team all four years. He was later inducted into Morgan State's Athletic Hall of Fame. Following graduation from Morgan State, he began teaching and coaching in the Baltimore School District, and compiled outstanding records in football, basketball and track. He also served on the basketball coaching staffs of some of the most prestigeous high school basketball tournaments in the country. including the Dapper Dan Classic, Pittsburgh, and the MacDonald's All Star game in Largo, Maryland, and Los Angelos, california. He also served as an assistant basketball coach at the University of Maryland. Currently he is the department head of Physical Education, Mergenthaler Vocational/Technical High School in Baltimore. he and his family reside in Baltimore.
