Regional students, as well as Glassboro students, will be able to apply to the Performing Arts Academy at Glassboro High School.

Students living within 20 miles of Glassboro are eligible to enroll in the Academy, at no cost to the student, through the Interdistrict Public School Choice Program Act of 2010. Students accepted to this exciting program will have the opportunity to participate in challenging academic classes and develop their fine arts skills through participation in specialized classes and ensembles at the high school and at Rowan University through a cooperative dual credit program. Openings for Glassboro and out-of-district students will be made available through an audition process in the areas of instrumental music and vocal music.

Students accepted to the academy will be given a specialized arts education where academic teachers team up with the Music Department to offer activities that include college credit Music courses, private lessons with professional with adjunct instructors and/or university faculty, and participation in both high school and college level ensembles. Students may take advantage of all honors classes as well as a large offering of Advanced Placement classes at Glassboro High School. The school's master course schedule will be built around the academy schedule and academy students will get priority scheduling. Performing arts Academy students will be able to take advantage of the high quality music courses and ensembles at Glassboro High School. Qualified students may also become members of the Tri-M Music Honor Society, National Arts Honor Society and International Thespian Society.

Music, and related arts, courses offered at the high school include Guitar, Piano, Music Theory, Music Technology, Concert Band, Orchestra, Choir, Select Choir, Jazz Ensemble Marching Band and Drama Class. Other opportunities include the spring musical and pit orchestra.

AREAS OF STUDY

Music students in grades 9 and 10 will be enrolled in the Glassboro High School Music Theory class. They will also receive weekly lessons with Rowan Community Music School (RCMS) faculty, at no cost to the student. Students in grades 11 and 12 may audition for lessons with a Rowan University faculty member. If they are not accepted, they will continue with RCMS instructors. Students in grades 11 and 12 also take one university music class each semester for which they will receive college credit at no cost to the student. Additional courses, if approved, may be taken at a reduced cost to the student.

Any student interested in participating in the Performing Arts Academy must complete a mandatory audition and interview process with Glassboro High School faculty before being accepted. Auditions will be based on the student's current musical ability as well as his/her potential for musical competence and achievement. The audition will include a demonstration of knowledge of scales, a short prepared piece in a "classical/traditional" style, short sight reading exercise and an assessment of musical knowledge and aural skills. After the audition has been completed, the student will meet with the panel and answer questions about their musical background, future plans and interest in music.
