### **ORCHESTRA POLICIES**

#### **REHEARSALS:**

All students are expected to give their best each day. There is no substitute for hard work and a positive attitude. Please read the following to understand class expectations.

- 1. By the time the bell rings, all orchestra members should be heading towards their seats and setting up the class for orchestra.
- 2. Students must have their instrument, accessories (shoulder rest, rosin), music folder and a pencil every day. *Only pencil to mark music!*
- 3. Students must be attentive during rehearsals. Students who talk excessively will lose points from their daily grade. A suggestion to the class during rehearsal can only be heard if the class is quiet and attentive.
- 4. Students are responsible for taking **Director's Notes** with their pencils on a daily basis.

Director's Notes are markings made in the music with a pencil to correct or improve the music we are playing.

#### ORCHESTRA POLICIES

- 5. All equipment must be put away at the end of rehearsals (music stand, folder, accessories, instrument), as we share this space with another class.
- 6. No chewing gum, drinking or eating (with the exception of unflavored water) is permitted in the orchestra room.
- 7. Using the bathroom should not disrupt the class. Have your planner filled out with date, time and location in order for the teacher to sign it before you exit. Once rehearsal begins, no bathroom breaks will be allowed.
- 8. Cell phones—MUST be out of sight during class. No ear buds or devices will be allowed during class. Your eyes and ears must be free of distraction during rehearsal.

#### PRIVATE LESSONS:

If you are interested in taking private lessons outside of school, Ms. Hasheian has several resources for you to choose from to find a teacher whose perfect for you. Please ask.

#### **FIELD TRIPS:**

On occasion we have the opportunity to travel as a music department. In all cases, we are an extension of the classroom. Permission slips, proper dress and behavior are always a part of our process.

#### A SPECIAL INVITATION TO PARENTS:

Your participation is vital to our program. Your attendance at concerts and performances goes very far in showing support for your children and the Music Department as a whole.

We would love to have parents to help with setting up and serving refreshments at all of our events. Having a "Reception" or "Afterglow" allows for a sense of community and pride. Please contact Ms. Hasheian if interested.

#### **ORCHESTRA POLICIES**

#### **GRADING:**

As orchestra class is largely performance-based, a significant portion of a student's grade is based on attendance and participation at concerts and rehearsals. Playing tests, sight-reading and written work will comprise the remainder of the marking period grade.

#### Rehearsal Performance and Participation (50%)

You will receive up to 5 points for every rehearsal based upon your effort and your attentiveness. A class RU-BRIC has been provided for you on a separate paper which outlines all expectations during rehearsals.

#### Scale Tests/Music Theory/Written Assignments (20%)

Assignments or performance activities will be given periodically in order to promote a particular set of skills needed for that activity.

All playing tests will either be **live in class** or submitted by **Flip Grid**, according to the teacher's direction.

#### ORCHESTRA POLICIES

#### Performance Participation/Attendance (30%)

You will receive up to 100 points for each performance in which you participate. It is expected that you arrive *on-time* for warm-up and tuning, dress appropriately for the event, and behave in the manner of a good audience member.

Please note: Our policy on attendance conflicts with other activities is as follows. Read the calendar in advance to know of any conflicts with dates prior to signing this contract. In the event of a game/concert conflict, please let me know in advance and **NOT** the day of the concert. We (the coach and orchestra director) will do our best to resolve the situation so as to not put you in an awkward position.

#### Extra Credit

If you are a member of another performing group outside of Glassboro Intermediate School and perform on your instrument, please notify the teacher and present a concert program to receive extra credit points.

If you perform in a music group within our district on your orchestra instrument or another instrument/voice, you will also receive extra credit points for your efforts.

#### ORCHESTRA POLICIES

#### PERFORMANCE UNIFORM:

The expectation here at Glassboro Intermediate School is that for all concert performances students are to wear solid black clothing, shoes and accessories. Women may wear black slacks or skirts that come to the knee. Men are to wear black slacks and black dress skirt (tucked in). All shoes and accompanying socks should also be black. Remember...we are on an elevated stage performing to an audience that is watching everything we do. Try on your dress uniform well before the concert to be sure it fits!
