I am writing today to provide you with an update on education throughout our district.

All district teachers continue to work under the district direction to check email twice daily and reply by 3 p.m. each day.

Here are a few school district updates:

J. Harvey Rodgers School – With yesterday's packet distribution, all students have assignments to take them through the end of April. Rodgers will look to offer some online learning opportunities beginning April 6. Principal Danielle Sochor will communicate that information with parents once it is definite.

Dorothy L. Bullock School – Bullock teachers are conducting online office hours/check-ins following the schedule that Principal Rich Taibi recently shared with parents. Bullock students are now engaged in a blend of packet and online learning. As we approach spring break, Bullock will transition to online web-based learning.

Thomas E. Bowe School – Bowe sixth-graders have been engaged in online work through their teachers' Google Classrooms since our temporary closure. Beginning on March 30, instruction for the fourth and fifth grades also moved online through Google Classroom. Glassboro Intermediate School – Glassboro Intermediate School students continue to engage in online learning through Google Classroom. Teachers are providing video instruction along with live chats. Please have children check in daily.

Glassboro High School - Our GHS teachers also have virtual office hours once a week. Hours can be found on the GHS main webpage. Students continue to receive all assignments online through Google Classroom.

Survey on Spring Break – Parents/guardians and staff, please take a moment to complete the Spring Break Survey on our district website before April 1 at 3 p.m. We want to know whether you are in favor of keeping Spring Break as it is or shortening Spring Break and ending the school year earlier.
